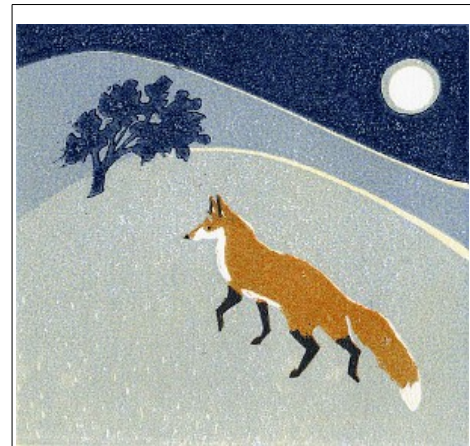

Book Illustration February 9, 2015, 7 p.m.

A lot of the book illustrations were done in watercolor and gouache. She has also worked with watercolor crayon, pen and ink, acrylic paint, and now in relief printmaking, primarily linocut. She has a degree in Illustration from California State University in Long Beach.



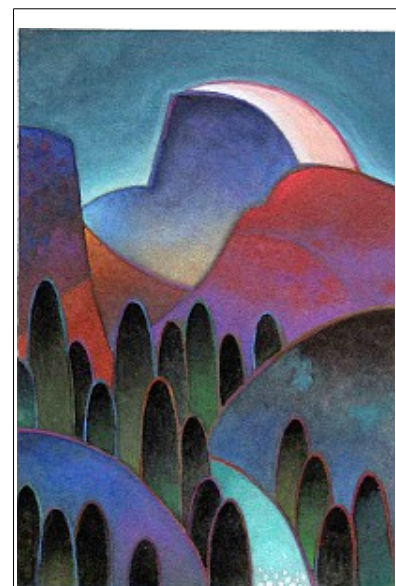
Fox by Moonlight

Anna Meyrick Mosaic Art

January demonstration in Review

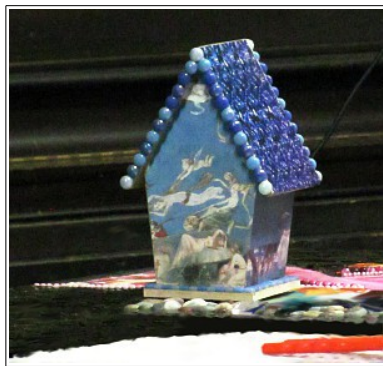


Mosaic is the art of creating images with an assemblage of small pieces of colored glass, stone or other materials. Examples of this art form can be found dating back to before Christ.

There are a number of methods for constructing a piece and Anna uses the “direct” approach. She glues down, then grouts with only sanded grout. She may put a finish on top. She likes her pieces to be flat, so she is partial to tile. Anna told humerous stories about bringing the material she uses from Portland, Oregon where she previously lived.

One method that Anna uses is as follows:

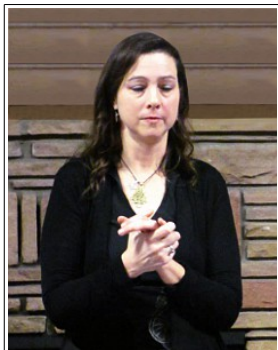
She cuts thick plywood, warp proof, to a desired size. She undercoats with acrylic then draws. She paints on her picture or design using acrylic paint, then mosaics over her painting. Some of the acrylic color may be left without tile.



Another approach is gluing on scrap booking paper to wood the same size and building up from there, leaving some paper showing. She often uses broken pieces of clear glass. Anna does reverse painting on this material and the treated side will be down on her work. This way, the artist can use magazine pictures or script such as poetry and they will retain their integrity. She likes using sharpies for lines. After using a variety of adhesives for gluing things in place, she now uses only Modge Podge.

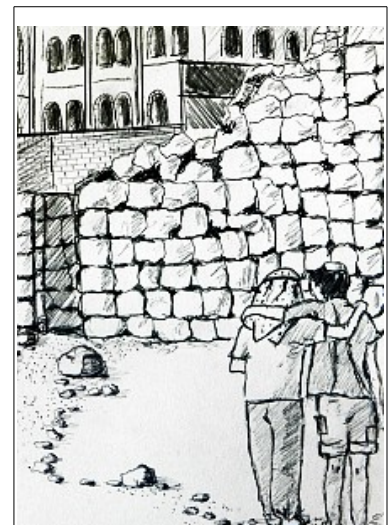

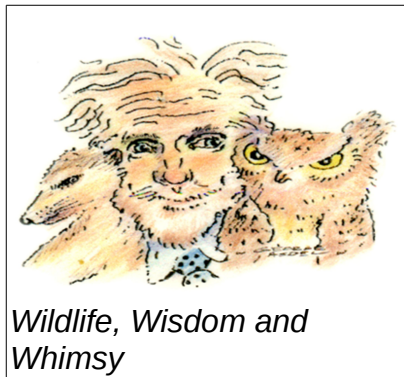
